

**Thomas P. Ravenelle**

Assistant Special Agent in Charge (ASAC) Thomas P. Ravenelle entered the FBI as a Special Agent in 1987. After completing New Agent training, he was assigned to the St. Louis Division, where he served on a violent crimes squad responsible for bank robbery, extortion, and kidnapping investigations.

In 1991, he was transferred to the San Francisco Division and assigned to investigate white collar crime cases, including financial crimes and fraud matters. ASAC Ravenelle was reassigned to investigate international and domestic terrorism matters in 1993.

In 1995, he successfully completed the Hazardous Devices Course at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama and he was certified as a Special Agent Bomb Technician. ASAC Ravenelle was promoted to Supervisory Special Agent in 1998 and he supervised several squads tasked with investigating domestic terrorism, international terrorism, and criminal enterprise matters.

In 2006, ASAC Ravenelle was promoted to Team Leader in the Inspection Division at FBI Headquarters. In this capacity, ASAC Ravenelle participated in more than 20 inspections of field offices, FBIHQ divisions, and Legal Attache offices.

In 2008, ASAC Ravenelle was promoted to his current position and assigned as Program Manager for the Cyber and Civil Rights programs for the San Francisco Division.

ASAC Ravenelle has served on both the St. Louis and San Francisco FBI SWAT teams, and he is currently the San Francisco FBI SWAT Commander.
